FS₂

Our topic work this half term has focussed on The Great Fire of London and the children have been able to recall many facts and explain the key events. The Tudor houses were fantastic and to develop their art skills further, the children have been working on colour mixing and have produced a colour wash to create a London skyline during the fire. Another focus has been online safety. The children have been learning about information and images which we should and should not share online.

Our nativity was a memorable experience for so many. The children worked so hard to make this a success and we know that many of you have said how much you enjoyed it.

Next half term, our topic will be 'An Island Home' as we learn about the physical and human features of coastal regions. We hope you have a good Christmas holiday, and we will see you in the new year.

SNAPSHOTS OF THE HALF TERM

YEAR 3/4



This half term we started by exploring biomes and learning about different ecosystems, discussing how climate and location affect the types of plants and animals found in each area. Next, we looked at food chains and food webs, where the children enjoyed creating their own webs to show how all living things are connected and depend on each other for energy. We have also looked at both the positive and negative ways humans affect the environment encouraging the children to think critically about how they can help protect our planet. In a fun and practical project, the children designed their very own biscuits and calculated the costs involved in making them. This activity combined creativity with some essential maths skills, and they had a great time tasting their treats! We also discussed online bullying, emphasising the importance of kindness and respect in the digital world. Overall, it's been a fantastic and enriching half term!

What a great half term we have had! Our history lessons have taken us through significant events, including World War I, World War II, and the Falklands War. One of the highlights was our fantastic immersion day, where the children had the opportunity to experience what life was like during World War II. They engaged with various activities that brought history to life, making learning both fun and impactful.

In addition to our historical explorations, we ventured into the world of art with Picasso's powerful mural, Guernica, examining its themes and context. Our science unit has also been an exciting journey as we have delved into mechanisms, learning about gears, levers, and pulleys.

It's safe to say this has been a memorable term filled with learning and enjoyment! Our topic next term is all about 'Our Changing World'.
