SNAPSHOTS OF THE HALF TERM

This half term, our topic has been 'Winter Wonderland'. We have enjoyed learning about the different seasons, with a focus on Winter as the weather begins to get colder. We went on a local area walk and had a fantastic time observing what happens to the trees, looking for animals, and noticing the facilities we have in our community.

We then compared our local environment to the North Pole, learning how different it is from where we live. The children loved linking this to where Santa lives, and we have enjoyed many stories and activities about him and his reindeer!

The children have created wonderful drawings, paintings and crafts, and we are beginning to see some fantastic early writing skills emerging too.

We are very excited for next half term, when our new topic will be 'Stomping Through Time' - a brand-new unit for this cohort, all about dinosaurs!

One of the biggest highlights was our amazing trip to Twycross Zoo. The children were thrilled to meet so many incredible animals up close. 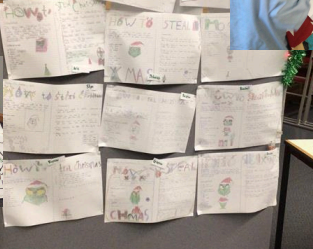

YEAR 3/4

SNAPSHOTS OF THE HALF TERM



This half term has been very busy and exciting. In Geography, we learned all about our local area, Nottingham, and compared it to the warm and vibrant city of Málaga in Spain. In Science, we explored skeletons in humans and animals, discovering how they help us move and stay strong. In English, we studied How the Grinch Stole Christmas and wrote fantastic instructions and a creative narrative based on the story. We also visited the pantomime, which everyone really enjoyed, and finished the term with some wonderful Christmas crafts that helped us get into the festive spirit.

This half term, Year 5 and 6 have absolutely thrown themselves into our Crime and Punishment topic. Our trip to the National Justice Museum was a real highlight and gave the children an engaging insight into how justice has changed over time. In design technology, the children showed brilliant resilience and teamwork while sawing wood and constructing their model guillotines. In English, we have delved into Wild Boy and A Christmas Carol, exploring characters, motives and Victorian life. In science, we have investigated the properties of materials, conducting a range of practical enquiries and discussing how materials are chosen for specific purposes.



YEAR 5/6



THE CAVE

This half term in the Cave, we have been working on our History topic. We explored who we are and why being different is something to celebrate. We talked about our families and friends, who they are, and why they are important to us. We also learned about how we grow and what we can do at different ages. In our final lessons, we looked at toys from the past and compared them with our favourite toys today.

Alongside this, we have been developing our life skills through cooking lessons, which the children love. Each week they have learned new skills and tried new foods. Sweet potato and onions were not a favourite, but it has been wonderful to see the children grow in confidence. Our craft activities focused on movement, making split-pin figures and cars, supporting fine motor skills and following instructions. Our favourite story was 'The Magic Porridge Pot' where all the children joined in with the actions.
