IT AND INTERNET SAFETY			
Pupils use the school network or school hardware to access extremist material	Pupils	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Our online safety policy makes reference to the risks of online extremist material. ▪ Pupils are encouraged to report any material they come across online which makes them worried or uncomfortable. ▪ IT security policies and settings are rigorous to ensure that pupils cannot access materials supportive of radicalisation in school. ▪ The school IT network has appropriate filters to block sites deemed inappropriate or unsafe. ▪ All log ins and usernames are monitored for inappropriate content, including use at home by staff.
